LOCAL WATERFRONT REVITALIZATION STUDY

The Town of Germantown has received a grant from the NYS Department of State to prepare a Waterfront Revitalization Study. The purpose of the Study is to improve public access and recreational use of the Hudson River and Roeliff Jansen Kill waterfronts while protecting and preserving natural resources. The Study will assess the Town's existing waterfront access and recreational resources, identify issues and opportunities, develop conceptual plans for improvement projects and recommend steps for implementation.



The Waterfront Project Advisory Committee meets on the 4th Tuesday of the month at 7 p.m. at Town Hall and the public is welcome to attend. The Committee is reaching out to community leaders and adjacent municipalities to identify common waterfront issues and the potential for joint planning. Three Community Workshops will be held to gather input from the public and key stakeholders and prepare a community waterfront vision.
