Subcommittee reports

Waste

The County and Jolene Race are running a food scarp program. They have expanded it and have chosen to work with us. Either next month or in April they will provide 55 gallons receptacles to collect food scraps (just fruits and vegetables) at our transfer station. County trucks will pick up scraps and bring them to their processing site. We're trying to identify a local farmer to do the processing. We've drafted an application for this job. Once it's finalized internally and we get Jolene Race's approval, we'll show it to the town board.

Education

Rose said they've closed off sponsorship applications. They have \$1800 pledged. We set a date for the winners on April 23rd and are ironing out the poster. We need to select judges. Tracy sent the rubric and the prompt to the teachers.

Green Fund

Mike Brown spoke with Peter Brandom, the Sustainability Coordinator of Hillsboro, Oregon. They too started with a \$5000 green fund and now have six figures, over a period of just 7 years. It's an internal fund, so only city employees can apply. They have a small committee and make decisions two or three times a year. They fund 2-5 projects a year. It's larger than Germantown but will be a good model.

County Report

The county government approved the Solar Community plan, now it goes before the Board of Supervisors in early February. Matt, Christina and Kaare went over the NYSERDA scoping documents and will submit them. We hope to pass a town resolution next month and launch the campaign. We need to sign up 10 people to get points for Clean Energy Communities.

Mark your calendars for July 16th, the Climate Carnival at the county fairgrounds. There will be a bike repair shop, free store, and repair café. They are also looking for musicians.

New Business

We should consider an Earth Day Event on Saturday April 23rd. We might do it at Palatine Manor or have multiple events around town. The library is interested. The Parsonage wants to do a program on invasive species. We should be at the dump to inform people about the food scrap program. We'll need to form a committee to help with this.

It seems like we have reached 120 points and will likely be approved for Bronze.
