#### Old Business

- Kellner Activity Building. Work continues- The contractor has relocated the kitchen hood and is putting in the final touches. Electrical work continues with the majority of the work to be done to finish the kitchen.
- SPEDES permit- A new requirement for a Climate Risk form has been requested and Delaware Engineering is in the process of completing it.
- Bard Parcel. A proposal to conduct the environmental assessment has been received from Crawford and Associates.

Motion to approve the Supervisor enter into the agreement with Crawford & Associates in the amount of \$3,500.00 made by Councilman Christian, seconded by Councilmember Suarez, with all in favor and none opposed.

Councilman Christian has a thought to have the electrical covered for the solar array on the Salt Shed. Councilman Christian is going to look into a DEC grant.

- The Columbia County Hazard Mitigation policy. Any updates? Councilman Christian has not received any updates.
- Local Law E- Filming. Any additional comments/recommendations by Council?
   Law still needs to be reviewed by the town CEO and any comments will need to be addressed. Supervisor Helsley said they are waiting for comments from the CEO. Corinne said a public hearing is needed. Supervisor Helsley will ask Brandon to have his comments in by January 27th. Public Hearing is set for February 11th at 6:45pm.
- EV charging station. Review of proposal to replace the existing charger. Is this State Contract or will we need multiple bids? Councilman Christian said Piso said no other bid needed. Councilman Christian said there are the two choices keep the charging station we have now or Piso gave a quote for two charging stations each with two plugs. Councilman Christian thinks this would be no extra cost to the town but there would be a higher yearly cost for the networking. Councilman Christian said he's not sure which way to go that they could raise the charging rate to 40 cents. Supervisor Helsley asked how many times both charging stations are being used? Councilman Christian thinks 4 charging ports is more than we need at this point. Supervisor Helsley recommended going back

to two ports. Councilman Christian will send the information to Supervisor Helsley and Corinne for a grant.

Formation of a Recreation committee. Amendment of LL#3 of 2005. Corinne said we don't need a Local Law to form a committee. Corinne recommended repealing of amending LL#3 of 2005. Supervisor Helsley recommends repealing LL#3 of 2005. Councilmember Suarez will call out for members and will work with Jan Borchert on goals the town is looking for in this committee.

Motion to approve formation of Recreation committee made by Councilmember Suarez, seconded by Councilman Kukon, with all in favor and none opposed.

Supervisor Helsley asked if we will be ready for a LWRP laws workshop in February. Councilman Christian will find out.

#### New Business

- Proposal by the Columbia County Land Bank to purchase 2 lots in Germantown. 169.-1-33.112 and 169.-1-33.200. Supervisor Helsley introduced Chris Brown Housing Development Coordinator for Columbia County. Mr. Brown said they started the process by creating a land bank which is a NYS public authority and a non profit, this non profit receives annual funding from NYS. Chris said there are 2 properties in Germantown on the list that were appealing to the land bank. Chris explained the process 1) removing the properties from the foreclosure list. 2) put out to a public sale- the land bank will bid on it. Chris said the town has a say in what property becomes and supports land bank. Councilman Sullivan asked who can buy these houses? Chris answered "yes" they can be bought by private homeowners. Councilman Kukon asked if the properties go to county sale can anyone bid on them? Councilmember Suarez asked what Mr. Brown is looking for from the town board? Chris just wanted to let the town board have an idea of what the land bank would do with the properties. Supervisor Helsley would support this. Town Board agreed.
- DEC Proposal to use Herbicide to control water chestnuts. Using a drone applying Clearcast to leaves of water chestnuts. Martin Overington said we have been invaded by 150 or so acres of water chestnuts which had blocked Cheviot Boat Launch. WAC and volunteers have been cutting channels through the water chestnuts. Martin said DEC contacted WAC in regards to the drone spraying the water chestnuts once a year. This would be done each year and then analyzed. Martin said the cost would be \$80,000 a year. Councilman Kukon asked if DEC would cover the cost? Martin answered, "yes". Martin said they have done other locations, the Mohawk and Oswego rivers. Kai Landow has spoken to people who have been using the spray who are deciding if they would go forward with the spray. The Riverkeeper is not opposed to it. Scenic Hudson is undecided. WAC conclusion is undecided. The study is positive. DEC needs an answer soon. Councilman Kukon asked what are the results? Kai said they are not seeing any impacts. Councilmember Suarez asked if any other communities have decided? Supervisor Helsley said that the town hasn't had much time to research this. Kai will have more information soon. Town Board is not making a decision tonight. Supervisor Helsley said there is not enough data to be in favor for. Supervisor Helsley will touch base with Martin.
